Dear Mark:

This letter serves as notification of Salt Lake City Corporation's intent to have the Hoberman Arch permanently installed in Salt Lake City, the host venue of the 2002 Winter Olympics. The location is yet to be determined.

The Salt Lake Art Design Board, directed by City ordinance to oversee the public art program and staff of the Salt Lake City Arts Council is actively searching for a suitable Salt Lake City location where the Arch can be installed and appreciated by Utah residents and visitors to the Capitol City. The Design Board will make their recommendation of the new location to the Mayor for his consideration and approval. Subsequent to the Mayor's approval, the Arts Council staff will submit the desired location to the appropriate Olympic representatives for approval.

We understand that the arch will be dismantled, removed from its current location in the Olympic Cauldron Park at Rice-Eccles Stadium, and safely stored in Salt Lake City until such time when it can be installed in an approved location. The storage area we propose, which is owned and managed by Salt Lake City, is a fully fenced, lit, gravel-base lot with 24-7 security onsite.

The Salt Lake Arts Council staff has met and will work with FFKR Architects, the designers of Olympic Cauldron Park, to design a new foundation on which the Arch will be permanently placed. City staff expects the arch will be installed in Salt Lake City by the end of 2015.
